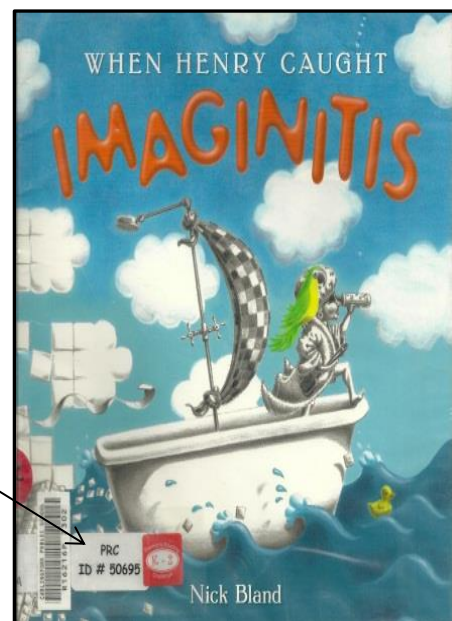




How to log in to the Premier's Reading Challenge website to record books onto your personal log.

All PRC books in our school library are clearly labelled with both a year level label and the PRC ID sticker. The books for K-2 students are located on a turning bookstand at the front of the library. Picture books for years 3-4 and 5-6 are located in a marked trolley throughout the library. Chapter books for years 3-4 and 5-6 are located throughout the senior fiction section of the library and the non fiction books for years 3-4 and 5-6 are located in a trolley within the nonfiction section of the library.

If you see a sticker on the spine of the book and an ID number on the front of the book that your child has borrowed, please record this ID number onto their personal reading log on the PRC website.



All grades from years 1 – 6 enter their books online onto their personal reading log which is accessed online through the student portal.

Kindergarten students will complete the Challenge in class with their teachers

Student login details are as follows:

User name is what the student uses to log in to the internet at school.

Usually first name.last name (possibly a number after their name). Password is the student's class if in years one and two and a self chosen one if in years 3-6.

To log on simply click on the logon icon on the left hand side of the screen.

To enter books, students click on the 'student reading records' tab on the left hand side of the screen.

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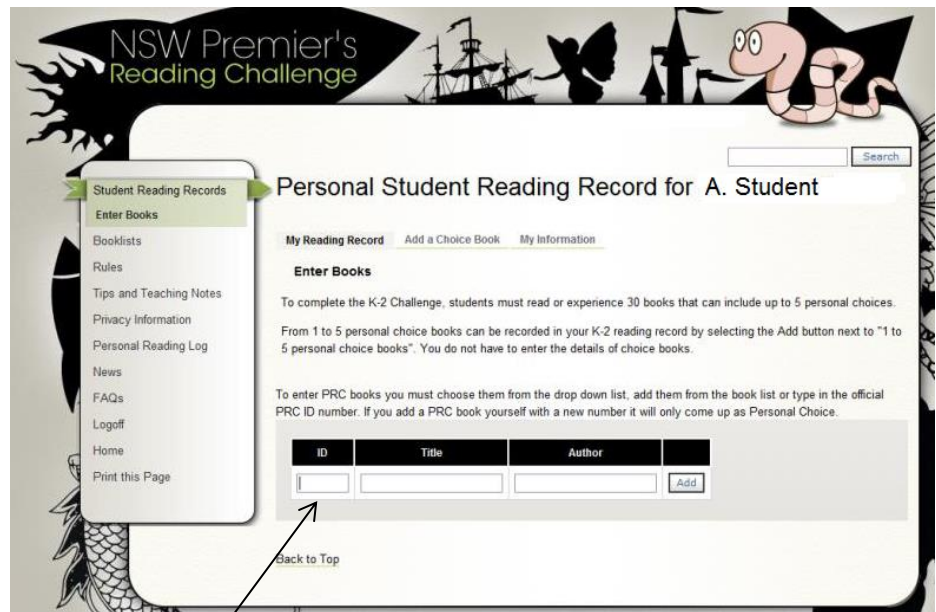
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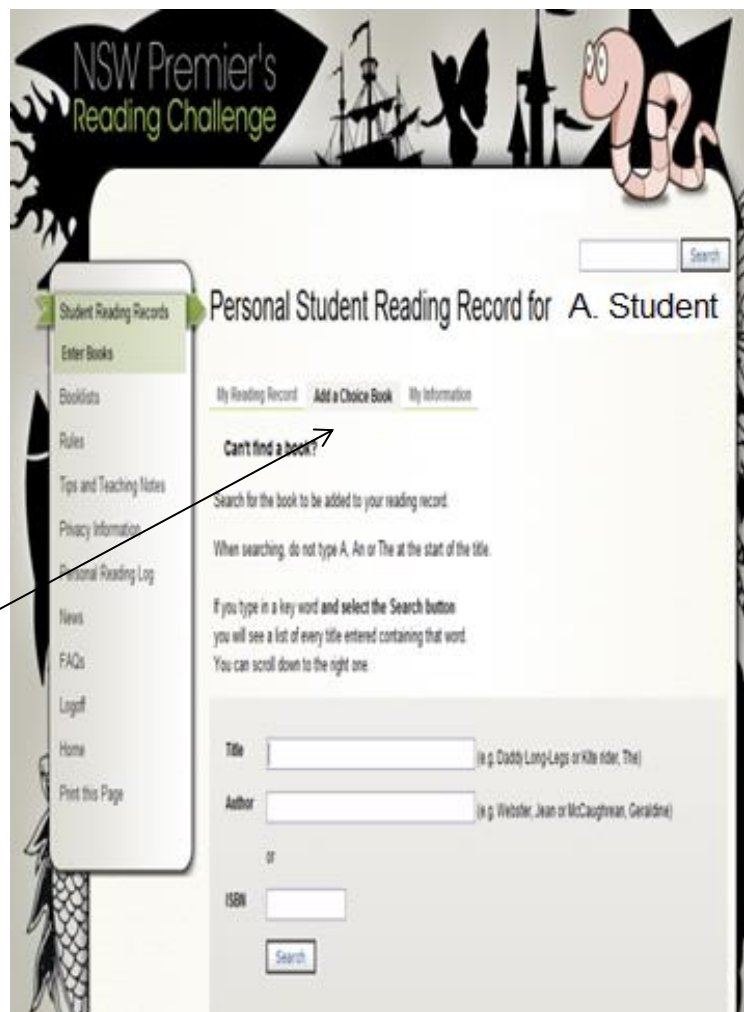
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
Schools are registered once a book has been entered into a student reading



If the PRC ID is known (a number on the front of school library books) this is what is entered where it says ID.



If there is no PRC ID then the book can be entered by title and author under the Add a Choice Book tab.



Upon entering all the required books online, students will be notified that they have completed the Challenge. This information will be sent through to the school where we will organise the student's certificate.

Upon completion of the Challenge, student's will have their photo taken and this will be displayed on our honour wall in the library. Their name will also go into the weekly lucky dip draw for a canteen voucher. The weekly draw is an exciting time for all students as they hope that their name is the one that is pulled out for the prize.

Certificates, photos and a commemorative bookmark are all issued to the students at the end of the year.
