WEEKLY ASSEMBLIES

This year our K - 2 and 3 - 6 assemblies will be held fortnightly. They will be held at 2:20pm on Thursday afternoon in the school hall.

3-6 assemblies will take place in odd weeks (this week), with K – 2 occurring in even weeks (next week).

<u>READING RECOVERY / LEARNING</u> <u>SUPPORT - 2018</u>

This year our LASTs (Learning Assistance Support Teachers) are Mrs Tillett (5 days) and Mrs Gathercole (1 day). The Department of Education funded Reading Recovery Program which has run at our school since 2010 has been discontinued by the DoE. This year the DoE has provided funding for every school to initiate Literary intervention programs tailored to the needs of the school.

Mrs Tillett will be giving one-to-one intensive reading tuition to a small number of Year 1 students for 30 minutes per day. Mrs Tillett and Mrs Gathercole will also work with small groups of targeted students experiencing difficulty in Literacy and Numeracy.

Under Department of Education funding, we have employed Mrs Catt and Miss Elliott as SLSOs (School Learning Support Officers), who will offer additional support to students with high needs.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE OR DIALECT (EAL/D) – 2018

This week our EAL/D programs have commenced. Under this program, assistance is given to students of a non – English speaking background who require additional support in English proficiency. Our EAL/D staff this year are Mrs Lau, Miss Belme, Mrs Welsh, Mrs Jenkins and Miss Chohan. At times students may be withdrawn from class for intensive tuition, or the EAL/D teachers will support the students in their own classroom, working in a team teaching situation with the classroom teacher. English is an additional dialect or language for over 70% of our students.

'ALL IN ONE' NOTE

This week an 'all in one' note will be sent home. Each year, we need to obtain permission/ agreement from parents for a number of policies/ contracts operating in the school. Rather than sending home an individual note for each item, we have grouped them together in one note. The 'all in one' note requires parental signatures (sometimes after discussions with your child) on the following policies:

- Code of behaviour for technology/internet
- Website and social media publishing
- Permission for the release of student information
- Premier's Reading Challenge
- 2018 Scripture/Ethics classes
- School Gardening
- Video conferences
- Anti-Bullying Student Agreement

Please discuss with your child the Code of behaviour for technology / internet and the Anti -Bullying student agreement so your child is aware of the expectations required of them and the consequences of non compliance. Signed notes are to be returned to your child's class teacher by Friday February 19.

<u>CPS ANTI BULLYING PLAN & STUDENT</u> <u>AGREEMENT</u>

Carlingford Public School prides itself on being a place where all students feel happy and safe, physically and emotionally. To help ensure this happens, we have an Anti - Bullying Plan in place.

This plan is available for viewing on our website along with a Powerpoint presentation delivered at a parent presentation last year. The plan outlines expectations for students, teachers and parents. The plan emphasises the schools 'zero tolerance' of bullying and emphasises that it is a team effort to stamp out bullying and all parties have a role to play.

To remind students of their role in keeping our school a safe and happy place, all children in Years 1 - 6 will receive an 'Anti-Bullying Student Agreement' as apart of the 'all in one' note to be discussed with their parents, signed and returned to school by Friday February 23. Teachers will also discuss the student agreement form in class as well. Once returned to school, the form will be kept on file for the year. Where necessary the form can be referred to if any issues of inappropriate behaviour arise. These agreement forms will be sent home this week.

COMPUTER USE & INTERNET POLICY

This week a Computer Use and Internet Policy for 2018 will be sent home to all parents and students as a part of the 'all in one' note.

The agreement outlines rules for the acceptable use of the schools computers and internet. Parents are asked to read the agreement with their children discussing and explaining each rule with them. Students are then asked to sign the agreement to indicate they agree to the conditions of use, while parents are also asked to sign, confirming that their child/ren are familiar with the policy.

Please return the signed 'all in one' note to your child's teacher by Friday February 23. Students will not be able to use the school computers until this document is returned.

HINDU SCRIPTURE CLASSES

This year we will be offering Hindu Scripture classes for K-2 and 3-6 students.

This is an additional scripture class running for students at Carlingford Public School. If you would like your child to participate in Hindu Scripture classes please visit the school office to obtain a permission note for this class or alternatively mark your preference on the 'all in one note referred to above.

Permission notes will need to be signed by this Friday February 16.

ICAS COMPETITION

Our school will be offering Year 2 - 6 students the opportunity to participate in the 2018 ICAS Assessments. ICAS is an independent, skillsbased assessment program for primary and secondary school students conducted by the University of New South Wales. Year 2 students will have the opportunity to participate in Mathematics, Spelling and Science. Six competitions are available for Years 3 – 6; Digital Technologies, Science, Writing, Spelling, English and Mathematics.

Another company has contacted me regarding after school care. 'Kicks' after school care is based at Carlingford Village. Students are collected from school at 3:25pm. Students are provided with a healthy afternoon tea, given an opportunity to complete their homework, participate in martial arts/leadership lessons and have supervised recreation time. 'Kicks is open until 6:30pm. For more details please refer to attached flyer at the rear of today's newsletter and contact Kicks directly.

<u>'NO PARKING 8 – 9:30am' - KEELER</u> STREET MORNING DROP OFF

The section of Keeler Street from the pedestrian crossing down to the tennis court is marked with signage stating "NO PARKING 8 – 9:30am". In this zone you are allowed to stop for a maximum of 2 minutes only between the hours of 8 and 9:30am. Essentially this is a 'kiss and drop' zone. Legally parents must stay within 3 metres of the vehicle and cannot leave the vehicle unattended. The purpose of this zone is to increase parking availability and traffic flow. Disobeying this signage attracts a fine in excess of \$180

DROPPING OFF /COLLECTING CHILDREN

Please note that there is no pedestrian access through the school's tennis court car park. Please use the pedestrian gates located in front of the library and at the side of the school administration building.

Parents are also asked not to walk their children through the pre-school car park. Please walk down to the gates mentioned above. I realise parents dropping pre-schoolers at the Multipurpose Learning Centre have to use this area to drop off and collect their children. Our children's safety is our priority. Car parks and children are not a good combination.

Parents using these areas as a short cut set a poor example for our students and potentially put them at risk. Your co-operation is much appreciated.

PLAY EQUIPMENT

Please note that students (and toddlers) are not permitted to play on the play equipment (Akshaye's playground and older equipment) before and after school. There is no teacher on duty during these periods and if there is an accident, injuries would not be covered under insurance. I know it is tempting to let your children play there, but in the interests of safety, your co-operation would be much appreciated.

BOOK NOOK

Welcome to the library column for 2018.

BORROWING

Book borrowing will commence this week (12/02/17) for all grades so please make sure library bags are clean and in school bags on the correct day. Kindergarten students will receive a new school library bag as a gift from the school during their first week of borrowing.

Borrowing limits are as follows:

Kindergarten:	1 book
Years 1-2:	2 books
Years 3-4:	2 books
Years 5-6:	2 books

Books may be borrowed for one week. Should a student need to reborrow a book because they haven't finished it, they simply place the book in the reborrow box during their scheduled library lesson and they may extend their loan for a week. As a school our goal for the student's borrowing is for them to retain one book borrowed in their tote tray for classroom reading and one book may be taken home for pleasure. As soon as either book has been read, the student may then come to the library before school, after school or during lunchtimes when the library is open to return that book and borrow a new one. We are encouraging students in 2017 to choose books that challenge them both in the skills of decoding and comprehension.

OVERDUES

There are only a few students in the school that have still not returned their books from last year. Even though many reminders were sent out before the year's end these students will be unable to borrow this year until the overdue book is returned or payment is made to cover the cost of purchasing the same title new, as per the School Library Policy.

BOOK CLUB

As a school we participate in the Scholastic Bookclub program. Twice a term Bookclub flyers are sent home with your child. There is no obligation to purchase books for your child but if you do, a percentage of total sales is donated to the school library for use to purchase library resources.

There is one brochure that covers all the age groups. To find age appropriate books, look to the sidebar which indicates the age group that the books on that page will suit.

Should you wish to purchase a book, simply complete your order online. Once your purchase has arrived at the school it will be distributed to your child in class.

If you have any questions regarding the ordering process, please don't hesitate to see me in the library.

Issue 1 Book Club flyers were distributed by class teachers last week and are handed out one week prior to collection.

So that means Issue 1 will close on Thursday 15th February, 2018 at 3:15pm. All orders must go through the LOOP Ordering System. No money will be collected at the school. Ordering is simple and safe.

Follow the instructions for the LOOP Ordering System on the order form. The students don't need to handle money or bring in paper orders. Due date posters will be displayed in classrooms notifying students when bookclub orders close. As a rule, it is usually one week from the date the flyers were distributed by class teachers. Finally, if there are any parents that can assist in the unpacking and distribution of the books ordered through book club, please see me in the library. You would need to devote a few hours each time the orders arrive, twice a term.

If you want to pay by credit card for your online Book Club order, **LOOP** makes it easy! It eliminates the need for paper order forms plus your online order is submitted to the school safe and sound.

- For a quick start, just click on ORDER in the top menu or REGISTER first to save your details for next time
- Select your school and your child's class
- Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue
- You can order for multiple children at once if they attend the same school
- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date
- There's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details to your school!
